Make your vote count

[Bulletin 19/2013](#) contains information about the ballot process. The ballot opens on Friday 13 September and closes Friday 4 October 2013, and I encourage you to have your say by casting a formal vote.

If a majority of employees who vote, vote YES, the first 3% increase will be paid effective from 29 August 2013. If the outcome results in a NO vote then any increase will not apply until after an agreement is reached.

A majority YES vote will end any industrial action currently being considered by the unions.
